Must have basic math; able to work in heat and cold; have great attendance and a commitment to do a good job. Problem solving skills are used on this job.

Job Responsibilities:

- Load/Unload and set up equipment for surveys.
- Clear brush and trees away from the survey line.
- Construction layout.
- Assist Survey Crew Chief in all day-to-day surveying responsibilities.
